## Don't Forget To Obtain Approval First!

LCG's governing documents require that the Association approve all proposed architectural changes before any work is started. The importance of this requirement cannot be overstated when you consider the reason for such a restriction. Membership in a community association requires compliance to preexisting conditions and regulations.

Aside from exterior appearances and maintaining property values, safety is an important consideration. Any electrical or plumbing work must be done by a licensed contractor. The reason is obvious. The consequences of a faulty wiring job starting a fire could negatively impact not only you, but many of your neighbors. The same applies to plumbing and water



damage. Then there's sound proofing on upper floors in consideration of your neighbors.

These are the reasons LCG has an Architectural Committee. Each application is reviewed to make sure the plan meets the association guidelines. It also requires contractor information, including licensing, insurance etc. Applications are available in the office and must be submitted and approved BEFORE any work is started.

Without proper approval from the Architectural Committee, you subject yourself to fines from the Association and Palm Beach County, and the probability of having to undo the work that was done illegally.

Getting the Architectural Committee to approve all proposed architectural changes is not just a good idea to protect your investment, it is a requirement! If you have any questions, please contact the office for more information.



#### Property Manager's Report

August has been a hot one here at LCG! The men have been busy with the up keep of the property.

LCG suffered two more lightning strikes this month. One at the office again, and one at Bldg. 7. The one at the office took out the FOB key system, channel 63, some of the security cameras and such. The one at Bldg. 7 took out an electrical line that fed the building and the building's South Elevator. FPL is responsible for the electrical line but LCG is responsible for the elevator line. This will be a 6-8-week process and a cost to the building of approximately \$8000.00. The FOB key system and security cameras are up and running. Channel 63 is still in process, hopefully by the end of the month.

Statement of accounts went out to those owners that are behind on their accounts. Please save yourself the late fees by paying your maintenance and special assessments on time. Those that continue to be left unpaid will be sent to the attorney for collections.

#### **East Pool Deck to be Closed**

As Yogi Berra once said, "It's déjà vu all over again.". If this article looks familiar to you, it's because it was in the July newsletter. With the torrential rain, relentless heat and staff vacations, the project originally scheduled for July as been moved into September. Barring more unforeseen delays, the work should begin sometime after the Labor Day weekend. Here's the information again.

The East Pool deck area will be closed. The pool, sauna, library and billiard room will be open as usual, as well as the BBQ area. Some of the gates around the pool will be inaccessible. The lower ones that come off the lake sidewalks will be closed during the construction. You will have to use the shuffle board gate, the gate by building 9 & 10, and the front gate.

The deck will be rebuilt from the base up. New pressure treated lumber will be installed underneath. The top deck boards will be composite decking material. They will be a grey color instead of the redwood color. This will help with the cooling effect on people's feet. As an added bonus, it will match the pavers.

The wooden handrail will be replaced. The concrete railing by the pool deck will remain.

Please respect the construction area signs during this project.




## **Asphalt Sealcoating**

Sealcoating is a protective barrier that is applied over the asphalt. It is also an effective way to help you avoid making costly repairs later on.




Think of it as a "sun block" for your pavement.

All these elements can penetrate the pavement and cause it to fade or break down over time. Oxidation from UV rays can cause unsightly and costly damage. Sealcoating is the most efficient way to avoid water, sun damage, other elements and chemicals from penetrating into the asphalt and causing deterioration and break down in the future.

In addition to the protective benefits sealcoating provides, it also restores the pavement to a fresh beautiful look.

Sealcoated pavements have a rich charcoal color with a clean appearance that greatly improves the overall look of the pavement.

Stains such as oil spills don't stand out as much which keeps the surface looking clean and well maintained. This makes the area look more attractive to everyone.

### Good News and Bad News

It's been said many times that watching Channel 63 is like watching paint dry! Well, here's **the good news:** 



Oh, **the bad news**? If you like watching paint dry—well, that *is* the bad news.

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#### ...We want to encourage them to go elsewhere.

In 2010, a two-week-long cold spell with temperatures below 40 degrees Fahrenheit killed off many iguanas, along with Burmese pythons and other invasive species that thrive in South Florida's subtropical climate. Those populations have since rebounded.

South Florida, including LCG, is being overrun with iguanas. Since the cold snap in 2010 reduced their numbers significantly, they have been rapidly reproducing to the point where they are becoming a nuisance. Iguanas possess atrophied venom glands that produce a weak harmless venom, and they are common pets to reptile collectors. Nevertheless, iguanas possess dozens of sharp serrated teeth. Although bites are relatively uncommon, they can produce serious injuries to faces, fingers, wrists, and ankles.

Some of the warning signs of an impending strike by an iguana include:

- drawing in a deep breath to make the body appear larger
- +raising front legs to increase height
- \*the lowering of the animal's dewlap (the skin flap under its chin)
- \*Some iguanas, however, have been known to strike without warning.

Green iguanas are an invasive species in Florida known for eating through landscaping and digging burrows that undermine infrastructure. They can grow to over 5 feet long, and their droppings can be a potential source of salmonella bacteria, which causes intestinal illness.

All reptiles carry a range of germs including bacteria, viruses, parasites and worms. Many of these can be transmitted on to humans. The most significant of these include:

**Salmonella:** Salmonella are commonly found in all types of reptiles and can spread from reptiles to humans when something contaminated with reptile feces is placed in the mouth. Salmonella infection causes diarrhea, headache, fever and stomach cramps and can result in septicemia (blood poisoning). Dehydration can be severe.

**Botulism:** Botulism is a serious and life-threatening illness caused by a toxin released by the Clostridium bacterium that causes paralysis and death. Clostridium commonly contaminates reptiles, especially aquatic reptiles.

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Other infections: illness such as campylobacteria (a bowel infection), leptospirosis (a liver disease), trichinellosis (a disease of muscles, the nervous system and the heart and lungs) have been associated with reptiles and while most are treatable, some can be very serious.

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
